### 1. Ents

Ents signatories have now been transferred over. Last year, some of the equipment used belonged to Dan Barker (Ents Officer 2008/2009). This means that new equipment will be needed for future JCR events. A new mixer will cost between £150 and £250. 1 or 2 microphones and stands are needed, largely for bar's 'open mike night' which means ents and the bar should come to a decision about the bar using ents. Ents will need to negotiate renting equipment to the bar and take a deposit when equipment is in use. Music stands. Ents has six speakers, 2 of which large ones made by a good brand but are bad quality. Ents officers are in the process of getting a quote for repair or replacement. This is not too urgent as we only need 2 speakers to run an ent. Needs to be done by October (Freshers' Week + Michaelmas events.) Renting a mixer is about £25 per hour. A good mixer lasts about 4 years (at ten ents a year) so it will work out much cheaper to buy one.

College tends to pay for marquee every May Week, but may not this year so ents would have to pay for garden party marquee. Would therefore need to put extra price on ticket, but would be less than £1.

DCAC agrees to fund new equipment out of depreciation fund.

Finally, Ents need to pay bar a debt from 3 years ago (AP believes about £250, but clarification needed).

### 2. TV in the Bar

Further to their previous expression of interest, the bar have not requested funding for a fixing to attach the TV currently on the bar to the wall (£67). They need to find out who actually owns the TV, whether they will get a freeview box and installation (AM believes that getting someone in college to do it would be the best way and would likely incur no costs). Health and Safety precautions and a professional job but also be considered highly on this matter.

### 3. Swimming and Waterpolo

Requested funds for Swimming and Waterpolo coppers. This was approved and it was decided that as of next year they should have a budget allocated to pay for these expenses

### 4. Welfare

Welfare want to put on 10 donut days and money for a masseuse for one session (if successful people can pay if they want it again). This means £71.55 extra for the welfare budget. The masseuse will come in for 2 hour sessions to either massage or show people how to massage. The DCAC agrees to this and to fund the first masseuse session to see if it is feasible and helpful to the students

This concluded the meeting, with a date for the next meeting to be set closer to the time it is required.
